ZONING AMENDMENTS

The ballot for the amendments to the New London Zoning Ordinance proposed by the New London Planning Board as submitted to the Town Clerk on February 2, 2011 is outlined below.

Are you in favor of Amendment No. 1 as proposed by the Planning Board for the New London Zoning Ordinance?

PLANNING BOARD PROPOSED AMENDMENT NO. 1:

The *Planning Board's Amendment No. 1* proposes to amend ARTICLE II, Section 16, the swimming pool fencing regulation, to conform to the state standard.

RATIONALE: The purpose of Amendment Number 1 is to provide a uniform standard for swimming pool fencing or 'safety barriers' as they are called. The requirement for "a fence no less than four feet high to prevent access by small children" has been in the Zoning Ordinance since 1997, but is no more specific than that. Although all swimming pools constructed after the adoption of the NH Building Code in 2002 are required to have a standard safety barrier, adopting this provision gives the Town a standard to refer to and subsequently enforce as a zoning regulation.

Are you in favor of Amendment No. 2 as proposed by the Planning Board for the New London Zoning Ordinance?

PLANNING BOARD PROPOSED AMENDMENT NO. 2:

The *Planning Board's Amendment No. 2* proposes to amend ARTICLE II, Section 11, the Temporary Structures regulation, to more closely reflect current industry standards and practices in order to be consistent and avoid confusion.

RATIONALE: New London has long prohibited the use of trailers for anything other than temporary uses (storage, office, temporary living quarters, workshop, etc) in conjunction with on-premise construction projects. Such practices were commonly limited to enclosed tractor trailer boxes for storage and small mobile home trailers for portable offices, but have now evolved to include a wider variety of Storage Containers adapted to accomplish the same purposes. This amendment is intended to have the regulation keep up with changes in the Storage Container industry.

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QUESTIONS

Question 1. To see if the School District will vote to raise and appropriate the Municipal Budget Committee's recommended amount of \$37,252,099 for the support of schools, for the payment of salaries for the school district officials and agents, and for the payment for the statutory obligations of the District. The School Board recommends \$37,561,701. This article does not include appropriations voted in other warrant articles. This warrant article asks the voters to raise and appropriate for the support of schools, the salaries of School District Officials and Agents, and for the statutory obligations of said District, and to authorize the application against said appropriation of such sums as are estimated to be received from the State sources, together with other income, the School Board to certify to the Selectmen of each of the Towns of Bradford, New London, Newbury, Springfield, Sutton, Warner and Wilnot, the amount to be raised by taxation by said towns.

Vote for only one: A or B

- A. \$37,561,701 for the proposed Operating Budget recommended by the School Board A ○
- B. \$37,252,099 for the proposed Operating Budget recommended by the Municipal Budget Committee B ○

Question 2. To see if the School District will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000) to be placed in the Special Education Expendable Trust Fund, established in 2008 within the provisions of RSA 198:20-c for the purpose of emergency funding of unforeseen Special Education costs incurred by the District. (Municipal Budget Committee Recommends 6-1) (School Board Recommends 8-0)

Question 3. To see if the School District will vote to raise and appropriate up to fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) to be placed in the School Buildings Maintenance Fund for the purpose of repair, unanticipated utility costs, and maintaining the school buildings and equipment, with such amount to be funded from surplus funds remaining on hand as of June 30, 2011. (Municipal Budget Committee Recommends 4-3) (School Board Recommends 8-0)

Question 4. Special Article To see if the District will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of thirty-five thousand dollars (\$35,000) to be used to demolish the property at 169 Main Street, New London (former SAU Building). (Municipal Budget Committee Recommends 6-0) (School Board Recommends 5-1)

Question 5. - Citizen Petition This petition is to see if the School District will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of seventy-five thousand and one hundred dollars (\$75,100) to contract with the Town of Sutton for the services of a position of School Resource Officer for the Kearsarge Regional School District.

The School Resource Officer will be a sworn Police Officer assigned to the schools on a long-term basis trained to perform a variety of roles: 1) law-related educator 2) law-related counselor, and 3) law enforcement officer. In addition, the officer works in collaboration with the schools and the community as a resource for safety and security issues. The School Resource Officer will assist the schools administration in maintaining a safe and secure environment.
